#### This month, we celebrate



on May 19th

Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. Crossing all boundaries that would separate us, the Spirit brings the wideness of God's mercy to places we least expect it—to a crowd of strangers of different lands and tongues, to dry bones, to our weak hearts. Jesus promises his disciples that they will be accompanied by the Holy Spirit, and that this Spirit reveals the truth. We celebrate that we too have been visited with this same Spirit!

By awesome deeds you answer us with deliverance, O God of our salvation; you are the hope of all the ends of the earth and of the farthest seas.

By your strength you established the mountains; you are girded with might.

You silence the roaring of the seas, the roaring of their waves, the tumult of the peoples.

Those who live at earth's farthest bounds are awed by your signs; you make the gateways of the morning and the evening shout for joy.

You visit the earth and water it: you greatly enrich it; the river of God is full of water; you provide the people with grain, for so you have prepared it. The pastures of the wilderness overflow: the hills gird themselves with joy; the meadows clothe themselves with flocks; the valleys deck themselves with grain; they shout and sing together for joy.

Read the verses of the Psalm above slowly and allow the imagery to flow through mind, heart, and soul. Can you see the mighty mountains which tell of God's strength? Can you hear the roaring of the ocean waves—or of the waves of the Bay? Can you picture the joyful beauty of the sunrise and sunset at the "gateways of the morning and the evening"? Do you recognize the gifts of the Earth that God gives to us with richness, abundance, and overflowing love?

May is a beautiful month, filled with beautiful things! We can more fully appreciate the glory of God's creation during this full month of spring. God shows his awesome power through his creative genius. This gorgeous month also gives us another chance to celebrate Easter—we

can visually connect the life of God's creation around us to the life given to us through Christ's resurrection. Both bring light. Both bring beauty. Both bring hope, renewal, and joy. God gives all of these things freely and graciously, as a true BLESSING to all upon the Earth. In the wonder around us, we see a small glimpse of the wonder of the God who gives it all so extravagantly. *Thanks be to God!* 

We continue in the Season of Easter throughout most of May. Easter finally ends on May 19<sup>th</sup> with the celebration of Pentecost—the coming of the Holy Spirit to Jesus' followers. God breathes upon us once again with the wind of the Holy Spirit and fills us with the flame of his love. We, much like the earth, are renewed—we are made new again.

In your walk with God this month, make an extra effort to enjoy and find joy in the Easter Season and in the World around us—a world springing back to glorious life, reminding us of the life given by our God, and celebrating the new life we have in Christ and the new life we find in God's created order.

#### **Visitation Team**

"Love God, care for people. They're connected, two parts of a whole. While visiting the sick isn't the only way to practically care for people, it's something Jesus talked about during his ministry. As he's describing the sort of actions that mark a faithful life, he says this: 'For I was... sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.' (Matthew 25:35-36)

Of course, if we spotted Jesus suffering in any of those difficult situations, we'd rush to provide help. But Jesus isn't talking about caring for him personally; he's equating caring for other people with caring for him. Love God, care for people—including sick and suffering people.

Jesus spent a significant portion of his ministry in the presence of people who were sick and suffering. He didn't shy away from helping those needing healing and comfort. Were Jesus doing ministry on earth today, it's not a stretch to think he'd often be with those who suffer in a hospital bed, rehab facility, at home, or in an elderly care center."

#### **A Little about Pentecost**

Pentecost, *meaning "the 50th day" in Greek*, is a season in the Christian liturgical year. It is the 50<sup>th</sup> day after Easter (and the 10<sup>th</sup> day after Jesus' Ascension). It is related to the Jewish harvest festival of Shavuot. Pentecost commemorates the coming of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks. This important event in the Christian faith is described in the Acts of the Apostles, chapter 2:1–31. On Pentecost Sunday we still celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit, as Jesus had promised after he rose from the dead. About 3,000 people were baptized that first Pentecost Day and the apostles started evangelizing, preaching, and starting faith communities, which to many makes it the real start of the Christian Church.

This year the Day of Pentecost is on Sunday, May 19th.


