You have taught children and infants to tell of your strength, silencing your enemies and all who oppose you.

When I look at the night sky and see the work of your fingers—the moon and the stars you set in place—

what are mere mortals that you should think about them, human beings that you should care for them?

How can the Most High God who made all those wonders have time to spare for us mere mortals? How can the Majestic One stoop far enough to see and hear us?

The Psalmist recognizes this great love and grace of God and marvels at it, as should we. The God who made all of those wonders also made you and me and our neighbors. The God who stands above the mysteries of the universe also stands beside us. The God who held the galaxies in his hand also holds our hearts.

When I look up at your skies,
at what your fingers made—
the moon and the stars
that you set firmly in place—
what are human beings
that you think about them;
what are human beings
that you pay attention to them?
You've made them only slightly less than divine,
crowning them with glory and grandeur!

Pause this month to look up into the night sky on a clear night to recognize the wonder of God's full creation. Then, give thanks to God for the wonder that is also found WITHIN YOU. Allow yourself to be amazed at it ALL—large and small, great and modest, far away and close to your heart.



- 3) "React" to our posts. "Reacting" to a post elevates it a small amount in the Facebook algorithm, allowing others to notice it. Every bit helps others get to know more about our church!

Find our church on Google or Google Maps and check it out. *You can get a link to our website from there—check it out too!*

Then, help others find our church by:

- 1) **Writing a review.** Help people learn about us before they ever set foot in our building by writing a detailed review. *If you have a picture or two of church life to share, it's good to add it to our profile as well.*
- **2)** Evaluating our information on Google and on our website. Help us to see our information "with fresh eyes" by letting us know your impressions. Is the website pleasant to look at, easy to navigate, etc.? This is our first impression to many folks. Help us make a good one!
