Who or what is your king? It's easy to say, "Jesus!", but we often give our allegiance to other things in this life, sometimes without even realizing it. We can also lose hope in the face of the obstacles and troubles of this world when faced with other kinds of various "rulers"—
i.e. money rules, corporations rule, political pundits rule, gossip rules, etc.

On the last Sunday of every Church year, celebrated on November 24<sup>th</sup> this year, we celebrate the *Reign of Christ*, also called *Christ the King*. It is a liturgical reminder that at the end of the year — and at the end of EVERYTHING— Christ is the one who reigns! It's

good to remember this fact a little earlier this year as we head into the fall and approach election season in our country.

No matter what bumps we hit along the road during the year, in the end Christ reigns. No matter what failures we had, in the end Christ reigns. No matter what accomplishments we triumphed over, in the end Christ reigns. No matter who manages our political or societal structure, in the end Christ reigns. When the End comes, Christ will reign. No matter what we face, what we endure, what we get stuck on, or what we get stuck-up on, in the end, when it's all said and done, Christ reigns.

The King to whom <u>we</u> sing in Psalm 72 is JESUS! Jesus is a king of justice, compassion, righteousness, peace, and love. Jesus is an Eternal King. Jesus brings God's love and hope to all people throughout all ages.

May his name endure forever, his fame continue as long as the sun. May all nations be blessed in him; may they pronounce him blessed.

Jesus is the one to whom we must be loyal; the one to whom we must listen most carefully; the one we are called to follow. When Christ's message of love, compassion, and forgiveness runs counter to the message of our society or our political party of choice or our own desires, we are called to turn towards Christ. **Christ is our King**, which is a role that goes beyond our own preferences and often runs counter to the role of "ruler" as it is often played out in the world. As it says in the Gospel of Matthew: "Jesus called them to him and said, 'You know that the rulers of the gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. It will not be so among you, but whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be your slave, just as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve and to give his life a ransom for many." (Matthew 20:25-28) According to Jesus, a true king —a true ruler— is one who rules in the strength of love, not with the lesser strength of might.

Take some time this month to read Psalm 72, give thanks to our King Jesus, and sing praise for the wonders he brings! *And remember, in the end, he is with you and you are his.* No matter what our society or world tells us, the real truth is that we belong to God in Christ.

Autumn has been a traditional time to talk about stewardship. So, now is the perfect time to teach your children the essential Christian principle that emphasizes responsible management of resources and gifts entrusted by God. Teaching

stewardship to children not only fosters a sense of responsibility but also encourages a lifestyle of generosity, service, and gratitude from a young age.

Stewardship is the giving of our time, our talents, as well as our treasures. It is our opportunity to give back to God some of what He has given us. Stewardship is about teaching children that everything they have comes from God and that they are called to use those gifts to serve others and glorify Him. Introducing this idea early helps children develop a heart of gratitude and an understanding of their role in God's creation.

There is joy in giving! We can teach stewardship by providing children ways to give of their....

**Time:** Encourage children to volunteer their time helping with church events, assisting younger kids or participating in community service. Even young children can provide their time by showing kindness or doing chores at home. This helps them to see that their time can be used for the good of others.

**Talents**: Every child has unique gifts – whether it's art, music, or problem solving, communication, leadership, etc. Church activities such as Sunday school or youth group can be an avenue to help them identify and use these talents in service.

**Treasure:** While children may not have much money, teaching them to give even a small portion of what they have instills the practice of generosity. Children can also help decide which toys or clothes they no longer want or need and help bring them to a collection site that benefits those in need.

Children learn by watching and doing. Make stewardship a family affair. Volunteer as a family to help a homeless shelter or food kitchen. Work together to clean a park or pick up litter in country road ditches. When the entire family is involved, children want to be a part of it. Parents and adults can equip children with a spirit of compassion, service, leadership and values that last a lifetime, and hence shape a generation that understands the joy of giving, the responsibility of caring, and the fulfillment of serving.




