

Every January is a new beginning! Even as much remains the same from one year into the next, January marks something new and unknown. It is a liminal time—a time of mystery. January comes inbetween the previous year, which has finally fully revealed itself, and the coming year, of which we do not yet know what it holds for us. This mystery sparks imagination! *What will the new year bring? What will it be like? Will it hold fortune or misfortune? Will it bring joy or pain?* We will receive some of each, as we do every year, but we don't yet know the types or measures. So, we muse and wonder and consider our lives more freely, perhaps, than at other times of the year.

Psalm 146 is a powerful prayer to begin the new year, for it sets intentions for a year lived in faith. In the beginning of the Psalm, there is

praise to our Lord and we are so reminded to start our year with such praise.

Praise the Lord, O my soul! I will praise the Lord as long as I live; I will sing praises to my God all my life long.

We thereby start the year by giving thanks for God's presence and providence in the year before. We also set our souls to give praise in the year to come. This year, like those that have come before, will be lived in the love of God.

We are then reminded to focus on God and not to trust in earthly things or rulers. Unlike God, earthly rulers are mortal, imperfect, and have limited view. No matter how lasting they (or we) think they are, their time is limited. They will not endure as God does. God is the only one who can provide for us and care for us in this life AND the next. Remembering this fact sets our heart again on God for the year.

The rest of the Psalm reminds us of some of God's actions and God's disposition. God made everything in creation that we see, use, and enjoy. God is a God of justice, help, freedom, and healing. God watches over his children and lifts up those who are bowed down with worry, stress, sorrow, or helplessness. God welcomes all — especially the outcasts and those overlooked by others. No one is seen as a stranger by God; instead love prevails.

Psalm 146 reminds us that God will not abandon us in this new year, but continues to work with us and in us.

The Lord will reign forever, your God, O Zion, for all generations. Praise the Lord!

REPORT: Your Endowment Fund

Did you know that Emmanuel has an Endowment Fund that allows us to share God's blessings with other ministries?

The fund stipulates that 20% of the yearly available amount goes to an international charity, 20% to a national charity, and 20% to a local charity. The remaining 40% is given out each year to the first three causes or to entirely other causes, as the Endowment Committee chooses. This year, the committee decided to give 25% each to four causes: two local, one national, and one international. You may be pleased to know that the following gifts were given this year on your behalf, as a member of Emmanuel.

- \$1,492.75 to Abundant Life Mission, a local ministry
- \$1,492.75 to the Menominee Children's Museum, a local cause
- \$1,492.75 to help those affected by Hurricane Helene through ELCA Domestic Disaster Relief, *a national cause*
- \$1,492.75 to help in Gaza through Lutheran World Relief, an international cause

Thanks be to God for our ability to help others in this way! And, thanks to those serving on the Endowment Committee for taking up this charge on our behalf.

- Download the Vanco Mobile Faith Engagement app from the App Store or Google Play
- Search for our Church
- Create an account to sign up
- Select your fund and amount
- Enter payment method, can either be a bank checking/savings account or a debit/credit card

If you choose to use a debit/credit card, the processing fee will be deducted from your donation. If you use your checking/saving account, your entire donation goes to the Church.

- You can choose to cover your processing fees
- Complete your donation

The Vanco church payment app prioritizes security with a range of measures designed to protect users' data and transactions. The app complies with PCI DSS (Payment Card Industry Data Security Standard) Level 1, the highest level of certification for payment processors. This ensures that all payment information is encrypted and securely transmitted. Additionally, the app uses SSL (Secure Socket Layer) technology to protect data during transmission and multi-factor authentication to safeguard access to sensitive information.
