They will perish, but you endure; they will all wear out like a garment.

You change them like clothing, and they pass away, but you are the same, and your years have no end.

The children of your servants shall live secure; their offspring shall be established in your presence.

—Psalm 102:1-7, 11-13, 25-28 NRSVUE

This month we begin the church season of Lent with the Ash Wednesday worship services on March 5<sup>th</sup>. Lent literally means "lengthening of days" ("spring") and signifies the slow movement from winter into spring; darkness into light.

During Lent, we remember the gift of grace given to us by God in Christ. We recognize how we "miss the mark" (as Julian of Norwich put it) and our need to lean into Christ's love because of it. We "miss the mark" by doing and saying things that are selfish and unkind and by not doing or saying things that would make the world a fairer, lovelier, and kinder place. In other words, we make mistakes that show the fallibility of our humanity. We call it "sin" in the Judeo-Christian context. Lent is the season of the year where we take stock of ourselves as honestly as possible and realign our hearts again with God so that we might be more faithful disciples of Jesus Christ in the world.

Do you remember the literal meaning of "repentance"? It means "to turn around". To repent literally means to turn back from the way you are traveling and go in the opposite direction. In Lent, we recognize the ways in which we have veered off course from God's way and we "turn around" so that we are again following God's path. In our turning, we come face to face with God! We turn back towards God and set our course once again on the principles that God values: compassion, forgiveness, generosity, kindness, honesty, and love. A part of that "turning" is admitting our fallibility and confessing our need for God's help in living a life of discipleship. More importantly, we recognize our deep need for God, God's-self! We need God's presence, God's love, and God's grace to even ATTEMPT to love a life a love. We need God for the strength to continue in the disciple's path of love and we need God's grace when we "miss the mark" in our attempts to do so.

As Lent begins, I invite you to read Psalm 102 in its entirety. Reflect on the need for God that the psalmist expresses. Use the psalm to confess your own sins, to ask for God's help and support in your daily life, and to remember God's presence and constancy in your life. And, give thanks to God for this season of "turning".

Blessings to you always in the name of the One who hears our cries and answers with love.

It is almost the season of Lent. This special time of year is a time to do a little "spring cleaning" of ourselves before we celebrate Easter. Psalm 51:10 tells us "Create in me clean heart, O God, and

renew a right spirit with me."

Lenten "spring cleaning" helps us to recognize our sins, repent, and ask God for forgiveness so we are no longer separated from Him. Lent helps us to strengthen our relationship with God.

Lent is not just for grownups. We can help our children grow deeper in faith during this Lenten season. Each of our Sunday school families will receive a Lenten devotion called "Stepping Stones Through Lent". This devotion is written specifically for kids where parents can help their child experience each day of Lent stepping closer to Jesus.

Our GLOW youth group will also be focusing our weekly devotion time on the Lenten season. We will explore our failings and things we have done that turn us from God to then finding ways to turn back to God and grow in our faith.

Through prayer, daily devotions, and attending church we strengthen our faith by realigning our hearts on Jesus. By giving up something special likes treats, TV, or screen time, we remember Jesus' sacrifice. And, through our giving and helping others, we follow God's will.

May this Lenten season bring you much peace and growth in your relationship with God.




Thank you congregation for your generous donations of soup! 163 cans were collected and given to Abundant Life Shelter and the Salvation Army Food Pantry.

# Ash Wednesday

#### March 5

Worship at 10:00 AM & 6:00 PM



The first day of Lent is Ash Wednesday. On this special day of reflection, we wear a marking of the cross in ash on our foreheads. The ashes symbolize our mortality – "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return." This reminder may seem despondent, but it is meant

to help us live more vibrantly and fully. In recognizing death, we are encouraged to <u>truly</u> live each moment. We also remember how much we rely on God's grace for our life both in this world and in the world to come. Come to worship either in the morning or evening to begin your Lenten journey by receiving ashes and Communion.



**During Lent** — March 10, 17, 24, 31, and April 7

Compline is a **Night Prayer Service** that is performed at the end of the day. It is a time for quiet reflection and preparation for sleep. The term "compline" comes from the Latin word "completorium", which means "completion". It signifies the completion of the day and leads into a deep and restorative sleep.

The best way to participate in online Compline is to download the outline of the service that the pastor will provide and follow along, participating in the comfort of your own home. Or, you can simply close your eyes and listen. **The service lasts about 20 to 30 minutes and moves at a reflective pace.** After the service, people often feel ready to drift off to sleep.

Join in online on Mondays this Lent in Nighttime prayer.
